SEVERE NUT ALLERGY

Parents Communicating with School

This can be done in a variety of ways:

□ Talk to your child's class teacher at the end of the school day. The beginning of the day is not ideal; however, if it is urgent, then speak to the Office as soon as possible.

□ If you would like a longer time with a member of staff then feel free to book an appointment at any time. You can do this by telephoning the school office, sending an email or speak to Mrs Crews.

Please feel free to contact us at any time. We all want the very best for your child.

END OF DAY COLLECTION

It is vital that we know how your child is being collected at the end of the day. Mrs Crews is spending a lot of time phoning Parents to check bus arrangements as we haven't been informed that there has been a change.

Please ensure you let the office know if a different person is collecting your child. It puts the School in a very awkward position when an adult is insisting they are collecting

a child and the School has not been informed.

ATTENDANCE AND REQUESTS FOR ABSENCE

Did you know that being 5 minutes late for School each day works out as 3 days lost over the whole year!



Punctuality and attendance are vital for a child's education. Please make sure you contact the office by 9am at the latest if your child is going to be absent. If we do not receive a call, we will phone you to enquire why your child is absent.

Holidays: Your child will bring home today a guide from WSCC regarding fixed penalty notices that we have been asked to give to all Parents.

A request for absence from School will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.

GATE

The green gate automatically unlocks at set times, therefore please try and push the gate before pressing the call button as it may already be open! When locked and you press to exit, when you hear the beep the gate has been released for you.

TEACHER AND PARENT INFORMATION SESSIONS

Sessions will be in the classrooms from 2.30 until 3.00pm. The class teacher will



talk about the curriculum, expectations for the year, how to help your child with Literacy and Numeracy and planned trips. For Years 2 and 6 it will also include information about National Tests. It will

also give you an opportunity to meet the team who work with your child and to ask questions.

I appreciate that some Parents will not be able to attend the session so a hand-out covering all the points discussed will be sent home.

QUEUING AT THE OFFICE

All forms and money regarding trips, parents evenings, clubs, tokens, vouchers, reply slips etc. should be Sent to the class teacher to be put into the class 'Office Zippy Bag', which comes over in the morning with the registers and goes back in the afternoon with any class post. This saves Parents queuing at the office, helps keep everything together for Mrs Crews and also helps our children to develop their independence. If you would like a replacement letter please ask your child to get one from their class teacher.

EARRINGS

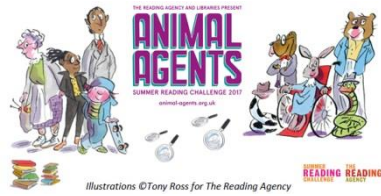
May I remind you that earrings should be **plain studs** only.

Please note that children **must not** wear earrings during P.E sessions. This is a requirement of all West Sussex schools. If children are able to take their own earrings out, they will need a bag or envelope to put them in. Or, even better, please send the children to school without them on their P.E. days. Find out when these are from the teacher. We can allow up to six weeks for ears to heal after piercing, during which time the child will need to cover them with their own plaster tape, but after that earrings must be removed. Any child who cannot remove their earrings for PE **MUST**

have completed an indemnity form available from the office.

PARKING



We have, after 10 months, finally managed to get a licence signed to allow the School to have a path between the Recreation Ground

and the School. This now in turn means that funding will be released to allow for a pathway to be constructed across the field adjoining school for all parents and children to use. Work will begin on this as soon as possible. It has been an unprecedented process in West Sussex involving West Sussex County Council, Safer Routes to School, The Chichester Diocese and Local landowner Mr Bray. The idea of a path has been around for the past 20 plus years and at every time has met with challenging obstacles. I am thrilled that we will soon have a path for everyone to access on a daily basis.

FOOD AT COMPTON AND UP MARDEN

At Compton and Up Marden School, we promote a healthy lifestyle - good habits which are formed when young, will last a lifetime! I would therefore like to confirm our school policy for items of food that are eaten in school:

Fruit and Vegetable Scheme for Key Stage One

The Government's School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme will continue this year.

Under this scheme, each child in KS1 is entitled to receive a free piece of fruit or vegetable each school day. The items will be fresh and of good quality and the aim is for the children to have a positive and enjoyable experience of fruit and vegetables. KS1 may bring in their own healthy snacks from home to eat at morning play, but please ensure that it either a piece of fruit or vegetable. No cereal bars or fruit bars please.

KS2 Healthy Snacks

Children may bring a healthy snack from home, ie fresh fruit (NOT fruit winders, cereal or fruit bars please), a box of raisins, a carrot, etc.

WATER BOTTLES

Even during the winter months, it is important that children have a regular intake of water. This keeps them refreshed and active both inside and outside the classroom. Please ensure all new school water bottles are CLEARLY named. We have water bottles available to purchase, from the office, for 30p.



GOLD AWARDS
