

## **Statement of Intent, Implementation and Impact for PSHE**

### **Intent**

The intent of our PSHE curriculum at Compton and Up Marden CE School is to deliver a curriculum which is accessible to all and that will maximise the outcomes for every child so that they know more, remember more and understand more. As a result of this they will become healthy, independent and responsible members of a society who understand how they are developing personally and socially, and give them confidence to tackle many of the moral, social and cultural issues that are part of growing up. We provide our children with opportunities for them to learn about rights and responsibilities and appreciate what it means to be a member of a diverse society. Our children are encouraged to develop their sense of self-worth by playing a positive role in contributing to school life and the wider community. ### **Implementation**

At Compton and Up Marden CE School we have a clear and comprehensive scheme of work in line with the National Curriculum. The PSHE curriculum has three core learning themes: health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world and these are supported by the Social, Emotional Aspects of Learning (SEAL) documents. We are working towards it also fully incorporating the RSE policy and making sure our scheme of work links to British Values, Cultural Capital and SMSC. In addition to this staff make connections throughout the year to the wider curriculum allowing children to see the application of knowledge and skills gained through PSHE. We also use assemblies as an opportunity to further promote PSHE, British Values and SMSC.

The teaching and learning of RSE is planned explicitly within each year group so that children know more, remember more and understand more. At Compton and Up Marden CE School we are aiming for children to become more aware of RSE and know the purpose of it. Parents are invited to attend meetings related to the teaching of RSE and are welcome to contact the school for further support and clarification as required.

## Impact

Through our intent and implementation of PSHE at Compton and Up Marden School we aim for all children to -

- know more and remember more about PSHE.
- recognise and apply the British Values of Democracy, Tolerance, Mutual respect, Rule of law and Liberty.
- demonstrate a healthy outlook towards school - attendance will be at least in-line with national and behaviour will be good.
- achieve age related expectations across the wider curriculum in addition to the core subjects.
- develop positive and healthy relationship with their peers both now and in the future.
- understand the physical aspects involved in RSE at an age appropriate level.
- have respect for themselves and others.
- have positive body images.
